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## FROM THE PRINCIPAL



### **HIBS Old Boys**

We are getting to the time of year where we acknowledge the contribution that our Year 13 students have made over (for most of them) the seven years that they have been at HIBS. HIBS has played a significant role in their lives and, having been at HIBS for about one quarter of the school's existence, they have played an important part in the life of the school.

There is always a degree of sadness as the boys leave. However, this is outweighed by the excitement of these young men as they head out for the next stage of their lives. We have spent seven years preparing them for this very time.

When the boys leave HIBS, most keep in contact with some of their mates from school and many maintain their links directly with the school by dropping in on occasion and supporting our sports teams, major productions, debates etc.

Perhaps because of the youth of the school, prior to now we haven't set up a formal structure which would enable us to extend our HIBS community to incorporate old boys, their parents and their teachers.

With this in mind, a group interested in keeping communication lines open to all of those who once had an association with the school has recently been formed. The group is chaired by former PSA President, Shelley Stephens and its members are current and former parents of HIBS students. The Principal of the school will always be a member. We anticipate that old boys will soon join this group of trustees.

The group has the unambiguous title of 'HIBS Old Boys' and it is hoped that, over time, most of our old boys, former teachers and even some parents of old boys will want to sign up as members. There are plans for events (some of these pertaining to particular year groups) and regular updates, a website and app, as well as administration support from the school. The website will be launched early next year and events will follow soon after. The aim is for the strong sense of community which we have as a school to extend to the years beyond school.

The first students who will be invited to join HIBS Old Boys are the 2018 Year 13's and other school leavers this year. As students leave HIBS, they are entitled to the \$1500 refund of advance on attendance dues. This year we will be asking that leavers opt for a \$1300 refund in order that they make the one-off payment of \$200 needed to be a member for life of HIBS Old Boys. More information will be provided, along with the Leavers' Form, to Year 13 students and all others who are leaving HIBS at the end of the year.

This will be followed by approaches to current old boys, later in the year and early next year.

This is an exciting initiative and we are confident that students will benefit from maintaining their relationship with the wider HIBS community.

### Senior End of Year Reports

### Internal Evidence Examinations (IEE)

These examination results are valuable for two reasons:

The grades generated through the IEEs provide the **evidence** for decisions about Derived Grade applications should this be required, and students receive feedback from their teachers about their examination achievement. The feedback indicates what they 'already know and understand' and what they still need to revise to improve their performance.



The Tournament of Minds began in Melbourne in 1987 as an initiative of the Victorian Association of Gifted and Talented Children and now has over 20,000 students participate internationally each year.

It involves working in teams to develop creative problem solving approaches and techniques. Students involved have the opportunity to expand upon divergent thinking, stimulate a spirit of inquiry and a love of learning. It is also lots of fun!

This year we entered three Intermediate aged teams into the Regional Competition. They were given a complex challenge and worked together over a six-week period to prepare a ten-minute presentation for the judges.

Our first STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) team consisted of Soham Rawat, Adithya Ramaswamy, Nhat-Hung Tran, Krupal Amaravathi and Tobias Burton-Wood. Even though they did not place, we were super proud of their effort and all the initiative and enthusiasm they showed.

We were delighted to see our other STEM team awarded second place honours in their category. They made a wonderful working model of an imagined creature they had discovered complete with a working Lego motor inside, and silver golf ball eyes!
