EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

In the event of an emergency, it is important we are fully prepared for situations where we may be at school for an extended period of time. How can you help? Can you please ensure that:

- Your contact details are up to date, ensuring we have the correct details for an emergency contact. These should be checked and updated via the HIBS Portal.
- If your son requires medication, please provide the School Office with enough medication for up to three days - this should be in a sealed envelope with your son's name and dosage requirements written on it.
- In the event of an emergency, alerts will be sent to parents via SchoolApps. This can be downloaded free on your iPhone or Android via the App Store. You will then need to select and subscribe to the Parent/Caregiver group.

HIBS Policies & Procedures

As previously advised, all of our HIBS policies and procedures are managed by a company called SchoolDocs. SchoolDocs updates, modifies and creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, as well as regular reviews. Our Board oversees these changes/additions before they are implemented, however as a parent, you are also welcome to take part in the reviews.



CURRICULUM

ACADEMIC GOAL SETTING

Students in Years 11, 12 & 13 have now completed their 2024 academic goals. Selecting appropriate courses for study is the first step in gaining academic success. This is followed closely by effective goal setting. You can see these goals by logging into the Portal and selecting 'Goal Setting'.

When students know where they are headed, they find it easier to get there. Take the time to discuss your son's goals for 2024 in the upcoming weeks. Ask him about how he is applying the actions he has identified to help him reach his goals. His goals will be included in his first written report in Term 2, and reviewed again prior to his final report in Term 3.



ASSESSMENT PLANNERS

Parents and students in Years 11, 12 & 13 have been emailed the Assessment Planners for the year. These Assessment Planners provide a guide for NCEA Assessment in each of their subjects throughout the year. Please be aware that these dates sometimes change and the most up to date version can always be found on the HIBS website by selecting 'Academic', then 'Assessment Planner'.



Interim Reports and Parent/Teacher Interviews

On the evening of Friday, 15 March Interim Reports will be published on the Portal for all year levels.

The Interim Report is a grade only report. It provides an early indication of how your son is settling into each of his classes. This Interim Report will be followed with Parent/Teacher Interviews in Week 8 (Thursday, 21 March) and Week 9 (Tuesday, 26 March). Further Parent/Teacher Interviews will be held early in Week 2, Term 2, on Wednesday, 8 May. This year two of the Interview sessions will be held online (21 March and 8 May), whilst the 26 March Interviews will be held at HIBS in the Auditorium between 4pm and 8pm. Further details will be emailed soon to explain:

- 1. How to book interviews via the School Interviews site, and,
- 2. How to log in to your interview once it has been booked.

HIBS Portal (Senior students)

All Year 11, 12 and 13 students can log into the Portal to access their NCEA results to date and as the year progresses. HIBS students should have their login and password to do this. 

After a few years of absence, HIBS is excited to offer students a life changing opportunity to explore Southeast Asia in April 2025.

Led by staff members Miss Sarah Tobin and Mr Jack Dowd, the School are partnering with World Challenge to offer this trip. It is an opportunity for students who will be in Year 11 - 13 in 2025, to challenge themselves and go out of their comfort zone whilst enjoying all the beauty Cambodia has to offer. Some of the activities include:

- · 3 day trek through the Chi Phat trail
- · Visit to Siem Reap and Angkor Wat
- Volunteering and contributing to a clean water and sanitation project
- Staying in remote communities interacting with the locals

This leadership expedition will focus on life skills, confidence, resilience and independence. It is focused on being student led, therefore as a team students take responsibility for the budget, transport, where to eat, activities and communication with locals. Previous students have said, "It gave me so much confidence to know I have the skills, initiative and resilience to travel in a foreign country and to be completely out of my comfort zone" and, "I learnt lessons in self-resilience and working as a team."

Cost

The cost per student is estimated to be \$8,500. This is an estimate cost only and expenses will be spoken about in more detail during the Information Evening. Parents may like to encourage their child to contribute to the cost by fundraising or by seeking some part time work.
